

Purpose



Saving



- `git stash`:
 - saves local modifications to new stash and runs `git reset --hard`
- `git stash save [options] message`
 - is called by `git stash`
 - saves modification with specific message
 - option `-p` allows to interactively select hunks
 - option `--keep-index` ignores all changes that are already added to the index
- **`git stash message` doesn't work!!**

What is in the stash?



- `git stash list [option]`
 - Prints the list of all stashes you currently have:

```
stash@{0}: WIP on Demo: 604fbc6 Merge branch 'Format-Outputs'
```

- `git show [option] [stash]`
 - Shows the changes recorded in a specific stash
 - Option `-p` shows diff in patch style

Applying a stash



- `git stash pop [stash]`
 - Removes a single stashed state from the list and applies it on top of the working tree
- `git stash apply [stash]`
 - Applies but not removes a specific stash
- `git stash branch [branchname] [stash]`
 - Creates and checks out a new branch, starting from the commit the at which `[stash]` was originally created and applies the stash

Delete existing stashes



- `git stash clear`
 - Removes all stashed changes
- `git stash drop [stash]`
 - Removes a single stashed state from the list
